Greg Paxton will be joining us as Executive Director in April, leaving his position as President and CEO of The Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation. The Georgia Trust is one of the country's two largest statewide preservation organizations, which he has led since 1981.

Greg is founding chair of the national group of preservation organizations, State-wide and Local Partners and served as a member of the Board of Trustees of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, where he has also served on a variety of task forces over the years.

He is past chair of the Board of Directors of Preservation Action, the national grassroots preservation lobbying organization. He serves on the Board of Directors of Midtown Alliance business organization and has been active in its Blueprints Midtown community development program. He has served on the Georgia Department of Transportation's Transportation Enhancement Advisory Panel and the Transportation 2000 Task Force. He is a member of the Kiwanis Club of Atlanta, the second oldest and one of the largest Kiwanis Clubs in America.

Prior to joining The Georgia Trust, Greg was preservation administrator for Historic Charleston Foundation from 1977-1981 and worked as site manager at Mount Independence in Orwell, Vermont from 1973-1976.

He is a graduate of Williams College in Massachusetts and received a Master's in historic preservation from the University of Vermont. He is married to Dr. Lynne Werner, whose family is from Saco for many generations, and they have a twelve year old son, Burke.

Greg was the top candidate for the position and brings an impressive and successful background in historic preservation.
